BRIEFING FOR IMPORTANT VISITORS: Joined by the adjutant general, Maj. Gen. Richard L. Pyrmire, who flew in today to join the party welcoming our visitors from the Pentagon, the unit today gave its official welcome to our distinguished visitors. — Heading the party, of course, was the Hon. Rufus L. Crockett, deputy assistant secretary of the Air Force for installations. Accompanying him were Col. Douglas J. McGill, executive to the chief of the National Guard Bureau; Col. Bob Roark, chief of programs and requirements, NGB; Lt. Col. Al Bunting, chief of the air technician branch of NGB; and Lt. Col. John Lednau, civil engineer, NGB.

THE MORNING BEGAN WITH BRIEFINGS: Col. Fred F. Bradley, commander of the 123d Tac Recon Wing, briefed the visitors on the military unit and its G-1 capabilities. Col. Bradley pointed out that this unit is the only Air Guard or Air Reserve unit in the country with a G-1 rating and the first to hold such a rating in about eight years. Lt. Col. John B. Conway, commander of the technician detachment, told Mr. Crockett of the physical facilities of Shewmaker ANGB and something of its other programs of operation.

FOLLOWING THE BRIEFING: A bus tour of the base and its facilities followed with lunch at the Mess Hall scheduled for noon. (Menu is swiss steak and tomato sauce, buttered corn, steamed rice, and garden salad for this noon.) The group was scheduled to tour the local vicinity this afternoon prior to a special reception at 6 p.m. tonight at the Officers Club in honor of Secretary Crockett. They are slated for breakfast tomorrow in the Mess Hall and have several options from which to choose Wednesday morning before their scheduled departure about 11 a.m.
