PRESIDENT NOMINATES AIR GUARD OFFICERS FOR PROMOTIONS: President Nixon has nominated to the Senate two of the Air National Guard's top officers for promotion.

Brig. Gen. I. G. Brown, director of Air National Guard with the National Guard Bureau in Washington, was nominated for promotion to major general. His deputy, Col. John J. Pesch, was nominated for promotion to brigadier general.

Colonel Pesch assumed his duties Sept. 1, 1966, after serving as commander, Air National Guard Affairs, ADC, Ent AFB.

The National Guard Bureau is headed by Maj. Gen. Winston P. Wilson, who directed the Air National Guard for 10 years before being appointed to his present position in 1963. He is the first Air National Guardsman to hold that post. With Guard service since 1929, General Wilson is the senior major general on duty in the Air Force.

TRAVEL TO FIELD TRAINING SITE: All personnel desiring to travel to field training and return, by privately owned automobile at their own expense, should file application with their unit orderly room during the March training assembly.

LOOK SHARP, FEEL SHARP, BE SHARP: AFM 35-10, is quoted for information and guidance of the officers and airmen of the Ky. ANG: "Hair must be neat and closely trimmed. It may be clipped at the edges of the sides and back, but must present an evenly graduated appearance. Long and conspicuous sideburns are prohibited."

OFFICER SELECTION BOARD MEETING: The Officer Selection Board will convene at 1430 hours, 14 Mar 70, in Room 163, O&T Building. Units should advise recommended applicants to report as scheduled.

SEIBER TO ATTEND CONFERENCE: Major William D. Seiber will attend The Annual Fire Department Instructor's Conference in Kansas City, Mo. for six days beginning March 23, 1970.



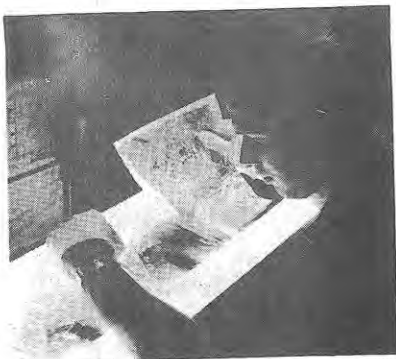
LACKLAND BOUND?...NEVER FEAR:

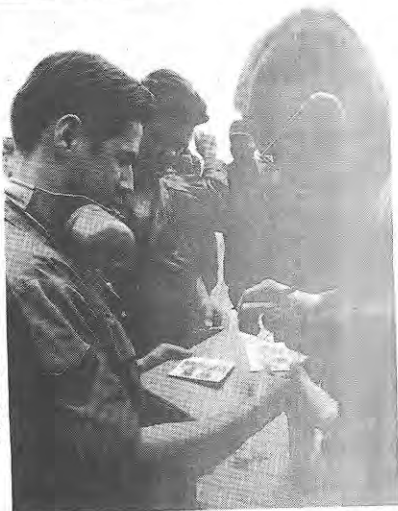

GOV'T. WRITES NONEXISTENT GUARD CAMP: Besides being tough to pronounce, a post office in Pennsylvania decided this week, Camp Oasd had closed a year and a half ago. So all the Manila envelopes that seemed to be addressed to it were sent back to the pentagon, where embarrassed personnel in the National Guard Bureau acknowledged that the envelopes, containing the National Guard's annual report and intended for newsmen in the Pentagon press room, had mistakenly been dropped into the mail. Each was addressed to a reporter, care of "presu desk, OASD, Pa." --military acronym for office of the assistant secretary of defense, public affairs. To the post office, "PA", even without a zip code, is Pennsylvania. But OASD? "Returned to writer," the envelopes were stamped by the Middletown, Pa., post office. "Base closed, 6/30/68."
