BIG SHOW TOMORROW: Some 20-22 distinguished civilian visitors from Kentucky, led by the governor, Julian Carroll, are expected to arrive here at approximately 9:45 a.m. Tuesday aboard our C-131 Conquest. In the party will be state government officials such as Kentucky legislators, civic and business leaders from Louisville, and several who have had long-standing connections with the Kentucky Air National Guard. Plans are scheduled to be discussed in some detail and finalized at a staff meeting of commanders at the base theater this afternoon. In the meantime, Lt. Col. Fred Cross, the wing deputy commander for logistics, is organizing the reception and other details.

WEATHER OUTLOOK: What does the situation look like with visitors coming in tomorrow? Well . . . the 4,000-foot ceiling we have today may be breaking up some but continued forecast looks for scattered showers in the area morning and afternoon. Wind, like today, will be light and coming from south-southwest. We had a low last night of 57° and expect a high today and tomorrow of about 70°. The weather situation has not restricted visibility.

FLYING IS RECOVERY: Most of the flying activity today centers around recovering the eight Voodocs which went to scattered cross-country locations over the weekend. We are, of course, leading up to some operational kinds of reconnaissance flying for tomorrow, if possible, so that our visitors can see what goes on in the 123d. One TF-101F flight went off this morning with Maj. Joe Kottak at the stick and there may be one check flight this afternoon, depending . . .

SOME THOUGHTS ABOUT FOOD: The haute cuisine for today and Tuesday looks something like the following: lunch today -- beef stew, steamed rice, buttered corn and salad; supper today -- spaghetti and meat sauce, buttered green beans and lettuce-carrot salad; breakfast Tuesday -- scrambled eggs, French toast, bacon and dry cereal; tomorrow's lunch -- pork chops, mashed potatoes, buttered cabbage and jello fruit salad; and Tuesday supper -- roast turkey, cranberry sauce, mashed potatoes, creamed corn, lettuce and tomato salad and apple pie.
