Coombs, 123 TRW Air Force Advisor and Colonel George Thayer, G-3, Fort Stewart, Georgia. Nine RF-101's were involved in the close formation flyover at the conclusion of the ceremony.

**SERGEANTS HELPING FELLOW AIRMEN:** Two Air Force sergeants at Tan Son Nhut AB, Vietnam, introduced a new concept to help their fellow airmen. They have developed an organization called people project. The project was originated and is spearheaded by SSgt Hunter Beaubian and Sgt Joe Garcia of Seventh Air Force headquarters. "It is the hope of people project," said Sgt. Garcia, "to inform as many military personnel as possible in the Tan Son Nhut area of their GI Bill benefits. We want to do this on a personal basis and simply not hand out pamphlets. The two sergeants don't want to limit themselves to merely helping people to understand their benefits. "We're here to assist a person with any problems he might have," said Sgt. Garcia. NEW SUMMER UNIFORM ?? If current tests work out favorably, you could be wearing a new two-toned blue, summer uniforms in a couple of years. The uniform, which consists of dark blue trousers and two styles of short-sleeve, light blue shirts, is being considered as a replacement for the present tan 1505 summer Service uniform. The test is to determine general reaction to a two-tone blue summer uniform and to make an evaluation of the durability of the fabric and color under hot weather conditions. The test period began in April and will run through the end of August. If adopted, the summer blues will be put into the Air Force supply system in about two years. The uniform is being tested at McCoy AFB, Fla, Albrook AFB, C.Z., Laredo AFB, Tex. and several installations in Pacific Air Forces (PACAF).

THE DAVENPORT HOUSE, A WORTHY ATTRACTION: The Davenport House, facing Columbia Square, is opened to the public six days a week. Columbia Square was laid out in 1799. When Savannah was a walled city, one of the six city gates was located here. This unusually beautiful example of late Georgian architecture was built between 1815-20 by Isaiash Davenport, master builder, for his own use. It ranks among the great Georgian houses of America, having been recognized as outstanding by the Historic American Building Survey in 1930. Measured drawings of the house are now kept in the Library of Congress.
