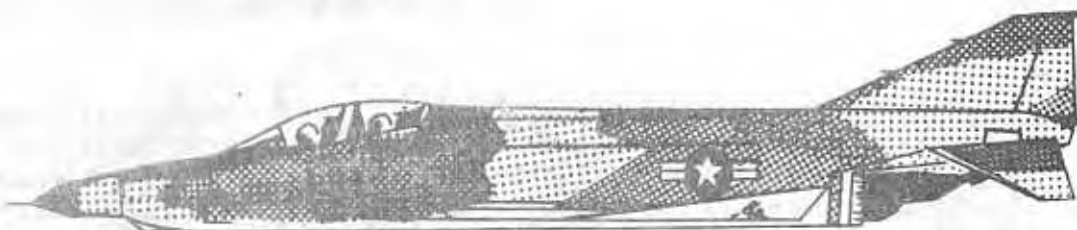




# THE PHANTOM'S EYE

AIR FORCE SERGEANTS TO MEET: CMSgt. Ray T. Price, president of the Louisville chapter of the Air Force Sergeants Association says the new local is rapidly approaching the 200-member mark. Their next meeting is Tuesday, April 11, at 7:30 p.m. in the mess hall of the O&T Building. Price also said their organization is considering the suggestion of starting a ladies auxiliary, so guests are welcomed and members are encouraged to bring their ladies to the next meet.

OUTSTANDING AIR GUARDSMAN: The Adjutant General has announced that SSgt. William T. Smith has been named the outstanding Air Guardsman of the year for 1977. Smith, NCOIC of the Life Support Section of the 165th Tac Recon Squadron, was commended for his heads-up leadership and good ideas. Among other things Smith constructed a trainer fuselage simulating the RF-4 cockpit to help pilots with ejection and egress training. When it was discovered that no such training aid was available through Air Force channels, Smith rolled up his sleeves and made one himself, complete with stick, ejection seat and wind screen. The tactical aircrews were the first in the Air Guard to get their own headgears fitted with the special plastic padding, because of Smith, who read how it was being done. He also worked on a project to devise special racks to arrange and store life support equipment. He was awarded the Kentucky Commendation Medal and "Minuteman Trophy."

FISHING COMPETITION SCHEDULED: The second annual KyANG Bass Fishing Contest will be held Sunday, April 30, at Moutardier Boat Dock on the Nolin Reservoir. Officials of the tournament said the entry fee is \$5 per person and at least one person per boat must be a member of the KyANG. CLUB PLANS NEW BUILDING: The KyANG Club's executive secretary, Maj. Edgar Schulz, said today there are tentative plans to construct a new 10,000-square foot club on the site of the present KyANG Club. "We don't have anything down on paper," he said, "but we are definitely planning the specifics." The new club building will include a larger lounge area, expanded bar, offices, and hopefully an automotive hobby shop. A number of fund-drive projects are in the proposal stage now in order to assist construction financing. Construction is expected to begin in early spring of 1979. Current club will be leveled and a shell of the new building put up within 60 days. Schulz said other provisions would be made to house club activities in the meantime.

**CARTER TO SENIOR NCO CONFERENCE:** CMSgt Walter Carter of Headquarters KyANG has returned from the Holiday Rivermont at Memphis where he briefed the ANG Senior NCO Conference on the functions of the ANG/AFR NCO Advisory Panel. This group, of which Carter is a member, is composed of six each of the Guard and Air Reserve and meets at least annually at Air Reserve Personnel Center, Denver. Of central interest are suggestions which benefit all ANG/AFR forces, especially if they have a direct effect on recruiting and retention. Anyone wishing to communicate with the Advisory Panel may submit ideas directly on ARPC Form 2 (Advisory Panel Recommendation), or talk first to the man himself, Walter Carter. Once a recommendation is received in Denver it is thoroughly researched by members of the ARPC staff, and eventually can reach the desks of the director of the Air National Guard or the chief of th Air Force Reserve.
