VOODOO TALES IS 'N-1': Since our Kentucky Air National Guard has climbed to the very considerable rating of C-1 for the combat-ready 165th Tac Recon Squadron, maybe you will pardon us for pointing out that this is the only "daily" newsletter in the entire Air and Army National Guard, or Air or Army Reserve. We know we could be in error about the Army Reserve, but we don't think so. We appreciate being a part of this fine unit, and this is our way of saying so.

TURN IN VEHICLES: The Motor Pool will be open at 7:30 a.m. Friday, June 20, to receive vehicles for turn-in. MSgt. Jim Hughes, superintendent of the Motor Pool, cautions you to allow time to wash the outside and sponge out and vacuum the inside of the cab before turning in the vehicle. MSgt. Hughes cautions all sections not to hose out the cab.

P.O.V. DEPARTURES: The policy on release of unit members traveling in privately owned vehicles will be based on clean-up and turn-in of buildings and equipment being used by that unit. Persons returning POV will be released and paid by their unit commanders only after the commander is satisfied with the condition of working and living areas -- which must be "sold" back to the training site. The time of release on Friday will depend upon the decision of the unit commander in coordination with the rear detachment commander, Lt. Col. Fred Cross, and his representative for supply and turn-ins, Maj. James Archer. A meeting of the personnel on rear detachment was held this morning in Bldg. 505.

AIRLIFT SCHEDULED: The first cargo aircraft will arrive at about 9 a.m. Friday to be loaded with the air-transportable photo and intelligence vans, the WS-430B, and is expected to be on its way by about 12:15 tomorrow, loaded on a C-141. The first C-130 will arrive at about 1:30 p.m. Friday and leave for Wright-Patterson to remain overnight and continue to Shewmaker Saturday. Another C-130 will get here at 7 p.m., leaving Saturday at 9 a.m. Three C-130s arrive Saturday with the first expected at 8:30 a.m., next at 9 a.m., and the final one at 10 a.m. Passengers going military air are expected to travel on the C-130 leaving at 9:30 a.m. The base C-131 will be the last aircraft to depart from Volk.

WITH STANDIFORD RUNWAY PROBLEMS: Voodoos -- nine of them -- leave today beginning at 1 p.m. to go to Wright-Patterson in connection with runway reconstruction problems with Standiford's main strip, 1-19. Four others will be flown by instructor pilots directly to Louisville, leaving at about 8:30 a.m. Friday. Total flying time for the entire Voodoo fleet this fiscal year should reach almost 4300 hours, compared with just over 4100 hours last year. It's definitely a feather in our cap!

TOURNAMENT CHAMPIONS: Volleyball champions are the men of CAM, who took the 165th in two straight games last night, 15-7 and 15-6. The Security Police were successful in defending their softball title second year in a row, besting Tac Hospital 11-3, CAM by 10-8, and the Comm-Weather-Safety All-Stars by 6-1.
