## General Lloyd makes an Inspection Tour of the Base:

After a briefing by Gen. Owen, Gen. Ott, Col. Yahns, and Col. Robertson at Wing Headquarters this morning, Gen. Lloyd started his inspection rounds of the base. His schedule was as follows: CJT Classroom, Bldg. 510; Communications Flight; Orderly Rooms; Airmen's Barracks; Parachute Room; Base Aircraft Maintenance; Fire House, Base Operations, Weather Flight, and Intelligence; Motor Pool; and Refueling Depot. He will fire at the rifle range at Stewart AFB this afternoon.

**Restricted Parking** - The parking of vehicles on any grass area of this base is strictly forbidden. Also there is to be no parking on the street within the training site area. Violators will be ticketed by the Security Police.

**Bus Schedule Revised** - Due to lack of participation, the scheduled runs for Savannah Beach will be changed. Busses will now leave mess hall on weeknights at 1800 and 2130 and will depart the beach at 2130 and 0100. Beach runs for the weekend will leave mess hall at 1200 and 1900, and will depart beach at 1900 and 0100.

The Savannah busses will have the following weekend schedule: leave mess hall at 1200, 1500, 1800, 2000, and 2330, and will leave the city at 1230, 1530, 1830, 2030, and 2400.

**Sports News** - Softball: today's game features Camron versus Supply at 1530.

Yesterday's contest between Supply and Combat Support was rained out and rescheduled for Wednesday, 14 June. Monday's game pitting Camron against 165th TSS has been rescheduled for Tuesday, 13 June.

**Ping pong tournament:** Those interested in playing ping pong must sign up personally at building 226 at 1530 today. Even those who had signed up earlier must sign again to be eligible.

**Golf:** Courses available--Bacon Park (municipal), 20 miles away, is an 18-hole course located on Skidway Road. Green fee is \$2.06 at all times.

Mary Calder (semi-private), five miles distant, is a nine-hole course located in Garden City on Highway 21. Open at 8 a.m., the course charges \$2.06 on weekdays and \$2.36 on weekends.

Palms Golf Course (public) is a 9-hole par 3 course 20 miles away on Levy Ave., Savannah. It opens at 8 a.m. and charges \$1.00 for 9 holes, \$1.50 for 18 holes and \$2.00 all day.

**Golf tournament:** an 18-hole tournament will be held at the Mary Calder Course. In order to enter, an entry fee of \$1.00 must be turned in personally at building 226 to MSgt Ted Bolton. Play will be at your leisure. Local rules will apply and green fees must be paid at the course. Cash awards for winners will be based on percentage of entry fees.

Deep sea fishing: The second deep sea fishing trip will be Tuesday, 13 June, and will cost \$16.70 per person, with six to eight in a boat. Those interested must turn in their money to MSgt Bolton in building 226 by Thursday, 8 June, 1530.

Movies: movies had been scheduled for showing evenings in the chapel building, but the film has not yet arrived, forcing cancellation so far. Recreation personnel are trying to arrange for transportation.

Long Distance Phone Calls - Placement of long distance call via base system should not be attempted without first obtaining a code number for your call from the Base Administrative Office, extensions 23 or 26. Upon initiating such a call, request the long distance operator to report time and charges. Within 24 hours after the call is completed, report it to the BAO using DD Form 1134. Autovon should be used for official calls when possible; consult the switchboard operator.
