THE WORD IS 'ON' TO SAVANNAH: Savannah summer camp, uncertain for a while, is on! Units and sections are working on their individual inputs to the training plan for camp, scheduled June 10-24. Lists of people going by automobile are due by Saturday noon, April 15, so individuals interested in POV should report to their orderly rooms. There will be no convoy of military vehicles to camp, in all probability, with only six ANG sedans scheduled to make the trip from here. Lt. Col. Harry Groschel will be the commander of the advanced detachment. At this time, no parade is scheduled.

SOME TO GO ELSEWHERE: In addition to some doing rear detachment duty here in Louisville, other troops are scheduled for training in their special career field areas. Parts of the Comptroller office will visit MacDill AFB, Fla., some from the Communications Flight go to Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio, a few from Transportation will go to Bergstrom AFB, Tex., and some from Supply will go to our computer support base at Blytheville, Ark.

OJT TRAINER COURSE AT SAVANNAH: Present schedules call for four OJT courses for trainers and supervisors to be offered during summer camp. Particular emphasis should be placed upon enrollment of persons who keep section OJT records, Group Staff was told today. Sign up at Career Control.

OVERDUE IN OJT?: Lt. Col. James H. McClure, group commander, placed emphasis with his squadron commanders today on looking at people who have gone beyond their scheduled review dates in on-the-job training. "Be sure the individual concerned knows he's not progressing at the proper rate," Col. McClure told his commanders today.

ONE THURSDAY IN MAY--SOUP: That's the decision on our community relations programs. The date will be designated later, but the Air Guard will definitely take part in a hot soup feast like the one last year. Lt. Col. Charles C. Sauer will be chef and we will have about 2,000 tickets to sell. The proceeds, as with last year, go toward scholarships to boys camp for underprivileged youngsters from the area. TAC PROMOTES UNIFORMITY: Air Force personnel at five TAC bases will begin in April to wear summer uniforms year-round. They are: Enfield AFB, La.; Hurlburt Field, Fla. and MacDill AFB, Fla. Dates for optional wear of summer uniforms at all other TAC bases will be April 1 through Oct. 31.

MEMBERSHIP NOT REQUIRED: Active duty "adults" of any United States service are no longer required to belong to an open mess to patronize their alcoholic beverage facilities on Air Force bases. Purchases may be made upon proper verifications made from one's identification card. Enlisted men will purchase through NCO open messes and officers will use officers clubs.

Personnel desiring lunches will purchase a special vending machine token which will be sold at base operations or passenger terminals at the same rate as now charged for an inflight meal. In addition to providing quick service to passengers and aircrews, lunches can be prepared in advance and maintained under proper refrigeration.
