The death of President Kennedy has caused all of us to reflect on the fact that this country remains free because its citizens are willing to give their lives for their country.



EDITORS NOTE* * * * *

DATE OF THIS PUBLICATION 20 December 1963

The original VIDETTE was published in 1862 and periodically thereafter as General Morgan desired until 9 May 1865. This publication was not published again until the 4th Howitzer Battalion issued the first copy since its discontinuance on 15 June 1963. This is the second publication by the 4th Howitzer Battalion - descendant of the original Morgans Men.

ANACDUTRA 1964

For the first time since the 1930's, the Kentucky Army National Guard (Artillery) will conduct Annual Active Duty for Training in Wisconsin. The dates have been set for July 11th through the 25th, however, due to the distance involved, we will be given two days for travel making our field training begin on 9 July.

Back in the '30s, the old guard, parent unit of this battalion, traveled to Wisconsin for summer camp. The few members that still remain in the battalion, say it was some trip. The march to Camp McCoy should be better, instead of riding horses, motorcycles etc., we should move, shoot and communicate in a modern manner.

Camp McCoy, Wisconsin, is located in the south western part of the state. Col Ridge has attended two periods of training with the USAR Command and General Staff School at this post. He reports that the highways from Kentucky to Camp McCoy are better than 90% new interstate. No mountains this year. The distance to Camp McCoy is about the same as it is to Fort Bragg.

During this time of the year the temperature ranges between the high 80's during the day and 50's during the night. This post is located in the heart of Wisconsin vacation land with many nearby lakes with pike, pickerel, muskie, trout and bass for the taking. Recreational facilities are excellent in the Wisconsin dells.

MULTIPLE TRAINING ASSEMBLIES

Beginning with last November our battalion underwent a major change in our training program, multiple training assemblies on consecutive days, two multiples back-to-back. So far we have conducted two of these assemblies and the results have been surprising. The attendance has increased from an average of 90 to 95 % on the old weekly drill system to an overall average for the battalion of 96.7% for November and 96 for December. The high drill attendance plus the added training time makes the new system ideal from the standpoint of getting things done.

This unit has lost 29 men through discharge since January 63 and recovery from that loss has been hard to overcome. It is felt that we can do the job and would appreciate the fact that the remainder of the battalion bear with us until we can catch up with the other units. We show an increase for the month of November for the first time this year. Our draft board has not been too active in the past but is now taking approximately 25 men a month for examination.

C Battery would like to welcome back three former members of the battalion. They are SSGT Bruce Correll, Sgt Hershel Bell and SP5 Joe F. Cooper.

Santa Claus is being real nice to C Btry this year by giving us a new armory. It is not anticipated that we will occupy it by Christmas but the contractor has done an excellent job and we will be sending out invitations to the battalion to attend the dedication in the not to distant future. We are very proud that someone along the line realized that we needed the new armory.
