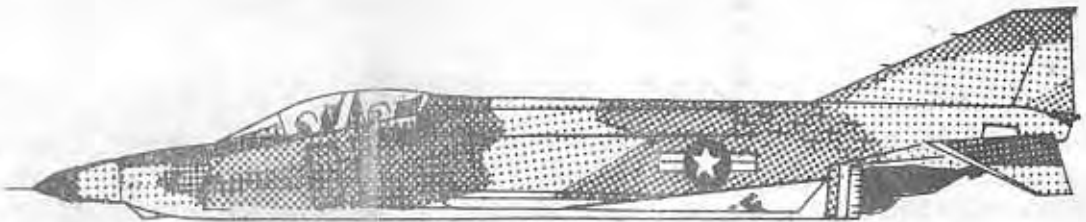

FEMALS FLYER FIRST: The nation's first Air Guardswoman to be selected for pilot training is Second Lieutenant Marilyn Mosser, Executive Support Officer with North Dakota's 178th Fighter Interceptor Squadron in Fargo. Twenty-two year old Marilyn is a graduate of the Air Guard Academy of Military Science and the holder of a private pilot's license. She is slated to enter jet pilot training early next year at Williams AFB, Arizona, along with nine women from the regular Air Force.

INCOME TAX DEDUCTION: Any Kentucky National Guardsman who was a member of this unit on Dec. 31, 1976, is entitled to an additional \$20 tax credit on your 1976 Kentucky state income tax return. This credit should be entered on line two of the return and designated with the initials "N.G.," says our legal officer, Maj. Walter Baker.

COURTESY PATROL: Beginning in February the unit will institute a new program on drill weekends called Courtesy Patrols.
