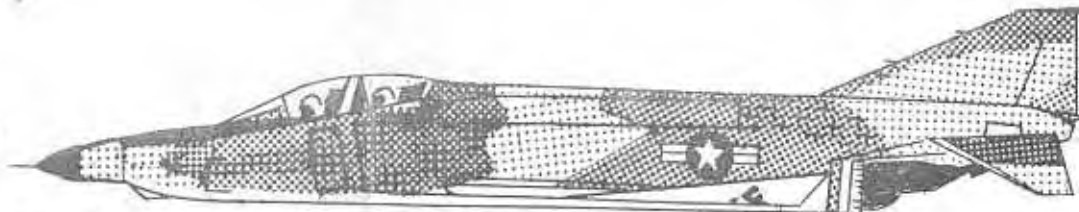

CHRISTMAS TREE SAFETY TIPS: When you choose your Christmas tree, make sure it is fresh. If the needles fall off at the touch, the tree is too dry. Keep the tree fresh by making a new diagonal cut in the trunk and placing the tree in a water-filled stand. Replace the water as it evaporates. Place the tree well away from fireplace, stove, radiator or wall. Use non-flammable decorations on the tree and throughout the house. Never use lighted candles on the tree. Before decorating the tree, check all electrical decorations for frayed, cracked, or worn insulation. Inspect the plug for possible damage. Be sure not to overload electrical circuits. Disconnect the tree lights before leaving the house or retiring at night.
