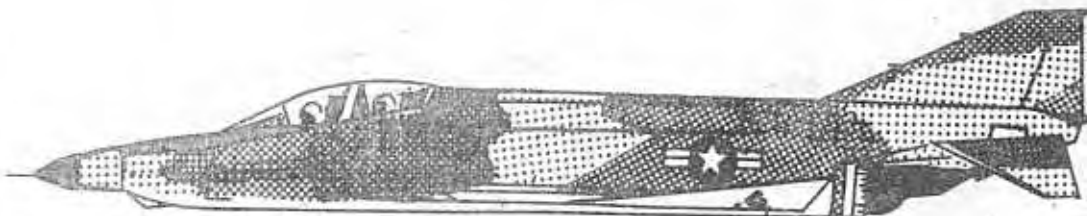

JULY PRACTICE CAN MAKE AUGUST PERFECT:

Roped off areas, boxed lunches, simulated lines, mobility, mobility, mobility are all standard operating procedures of the day. Accelerated preparations for next month's Operational Readiness Inspection began in the wee hours this morning for mobility flight augmentees. Last minute checks, cargo loading, personnel equipment review and other mobility operations will hopefully lead to a very successful ORI team visit during the August UTA.

UMBRELLAS AUTHORIZED FOR MEN: Effective immediately, umbrellas may be used by all Air Force members in uniform when weather conditions warrant. Personnel in uniform may carry any commercially purchased solid-black or dark-blue umbrella as long as it has no ornamentation. The umbrella will be carried in the left hand so that personnel can properly salute. It will not be carried during military formations or when working in areas where the umbrella would hamper safety. Previously, only Air Force women in uniform were permitted to use the umbrella. The approval follows a test conducted in the Washington D.C. area.

SHIRT SUPPLIES STILL SHORT, SAYS BX: The new Air Force, convertible-collar, short-sleeved shirt continues to be available only in limited numbers because of a fabric shortage. The Army and Air Force Exchange Service said the short supply is expected to continue until at least the fall. The exchange has sold the short-sleeved, epaulet shirts since regular production began in January. But the supply has never caught up with demand. Only one mill currently produces the shirt's polyester-and-cotton-blend fabric. As a result, only a limited number of the shirts can be manufactured. The Air Force is looking for additional fabric sources. Meantime, the exchange is allocating shirt shipments to achieve the most equitable distribution to military clothing sales stores.

RIFLE TEAM STRIKES SILVER: The Air Guard Rifle Team won five silver medals at the Camp Atterbury Regional National Rifle Association matches held June 30 and July 1. The Kentucky State All Guard Team won second place against several tough national teams. The Kentucky team was composed of MSGT Engle, NCOIC Ground Safety, and three Army Guardsmen. In the individual matches, MSGT Engle won second place in the rapid fire sitting position with a 193-5X rifle. Lt Wells, Chief of Ground Safety, shot his way to three second place awards in the rapid fire sitting match, 500 yard prone match and an aggregate match composed of total points in three positions. The rifle team will have a shoot out with Kentucky Army National Guard team August 25 and 26.
