**A PAY RAISE!** In case you have not gotten all of the details, we are pleased to announce a 5.52 per cent pay raise which will be found added to your pay check for this month. It comes as result of an executive order by President Ford and was effective Oct. 1. One previous effort to delay the increase was overturned by the Congress with the final vote coming in the Senate Sept. 19. The raise also effects increases in quarters and subsistence pay, as well as for base pay.

**KENTUCKIANS WIN PISTOL:** Three members of the Air Guard took part in the first-place efforts by the Kentucky pistol team at the Winston P. Wilson matches at Little Rock, Ark., in mid-September.
